It found that foreign investors tend to be momentum investors, buying past winning stocks and selling past losers. Domestic investors, particularly households, tend to be contrarians. The distinctions in behavior are consistent across a variety of past-return intervals. The portfolios of foreign investors seem to outperform the portfolios of households, even after controlling for behavior differences.¹

Ansari and Moid (2013)² investigated the investment behavior among young age between 25 and 35 years in the city of Lucknow with a sample size of 200. The researcher used chi-square test to analyze the data. It can conclude that investment is dependent on age and income but not on gender.

Parimalakanthi and Ashokkumar (2015) was invested investment behavior of the individual at Coimbatore city with 10 factors viz., a savings account in a bank, an FD account in banks, Government securities, corporate bonds, insurance policy, real estate, commodities, shares and MF's, chit funds and gold and silver.
